

Three Sanpete students win Energy Solutions scholarships

SALT LAKE CITY—Three Sanpete County sophomores have already taken the first step toward bachelor's degrees in math, science or engineering.

The three students won \$2,000 scholarships in a competition sponsored by the Energy Solutions Foundation of Salt Lake City.

Scholarships were awarded to one student from each of 120 Utah high schools.

The winners are Cami Carlisle of Gunnison Valley High School, Meg Jenkins of Manti High School and Brandon Mabey of North Sanpete High School.

Cami is the daughter of Thayne and Becky Carlisle of Gunnison. She participates in volleyball, basketball and softball and has a 4.0 GPA.

Meg is the daughter of Mitch and Melanie Jenkins of Manti. She plays tennis and softball and is in the school orchestra. She has a 3.98 GPA and is considering going into meteorology.

Brandon is the son of Steven Mabey of Spring City. He has participated in cross-country and will be inducted into the National Honor Society. He has a 3.9 GPA.

The students won't receive the money until they graduate from high school and enter college. At that time, they will be entered in the second round of the Energy Solutions scholarship competition, where they will compete with other first-round winners. In the second round, they will have a chance to win an additional \$2,500, \$5,000 or \$25,000 scholarship.

Energy Solutions Chairman Jordan Clements said the goal of the scholarship program is to help create the next generation of mathematicians, scientists and engineers for America's future.
